Overall, 1 in 2 Coloradans is female; however,




7 women for every 8 men live in frontier* counties

*Frontier: defined as a county with a population density of less than six people per square mile.


Crowley and Bent Counties have the **lowest concentration of women** in Colorado

Colorado Health Indicators




In Colorado, women are **more likely to go to college** than men

Health Insurance in Colorado




Of uninsured Coloradans:

13% of women and **22%** of men do not know how to purchase or enroll in health insurance




Colorado's insured adults, age 19-64
