POSITIONS ON STATEWIDE BALLOT MEASURES



VOTE YES:

PROPOSITION NN: SAY YES TO COLORADO KIDS

This measure would increase public school funding by 50% over the next 10 years, without raising taxes. The money must go toward better teacher pay, keeping good teachers, smaller classes, and more career and technical education.

AMENDMENT 87: THE INCOME TAX FAIRNESS ACT

97% of Colorado taxpayers would get a tax cut under this measure. Only income above \$500,000, for individuals and corporations, would be taxed at a higher rate. Every new dollar must go to K-12 schools, health care, and child care, and an outside group will check each year that the money is spent the right way.

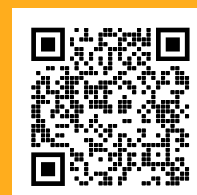

POSITIONS ON STATEWIDE BALLOT MEASURES



VOTE NO:

INITIATIVE 136: LOCKS IN AN UNFAIR TAX SYSTEM

Locks Colorado into a 4.4% income tax rate, making it harder to pay for the services our communities need and keeping more of the tax burden on working people.

PROPOSITION 132: EXPANDS PRISON SENTENCES FOR FENTANYL POSSESSION

Makes any amount of fentanyl possession a felony with mandatory 8–32-year prison sentences, even for first-time cases or when someone didn't know fentanyl was present. It increases incarceration and state costs without addressing addiction or investing in treatment and harm reduction.

AMENDMENT 81: PUTS IMMIGRANT COMMUNITIES AT GREATER RISK

Requires law enforcement to notify ICE when someone is charged with certain crimes, before they are found guilty. It would increase the risk of immigration enforcement based on appearance, accent, or perceived background.

INITIATIVE 134: PUTS KIDS IN HARM'S WAY

Takes decisions away from parents, schools, and athletic experts and hands them to the government. It's so poorly written that any girl could face an invasive gender check if she's accused of being transgender. With no appeals process, families are powerless to stop these invasive checks.

INITIATIVE 135: A THREAT TO FAMILY RIGHTS

Takes healthcare decisions out of parents' and doctors' hands, with no way to appeal if the government gets it wrong. This measure could also interfere with medically necessary care for serious conditions that affect kids well beyond transgender youth.

AMENDMENT 85: MAKES BALLOT INFORMATION HARDER TO UNDERSTAND

Strict reading-level rules could leave out important information about taxes and state funding and create more legal challenges.

AMENDMENT 84: ADDS NEW HURDLES TO VOTING

Requires mail voters to provide their signature plus an identification number, creating another hurdle to voting and raising privacy concerns when personal information is included with ballots.
